

Be Respectful


- Respect others, school, and personal property.

Classes Begin at 8:50 am


*Late arrivals (after 8:50 am) must enter at door 1 (main office) and be signed in by a parent/guardian



Food at School

3rd Grade Lunch

The Free Meal Program, provided by the USDA the past two years, has ended. At the start of the 2022-2023 school year, if your student is not on the free- or reduced-meal program, they will need to pay for breakfast and lunch meals through their food service meal account. *Payments on account will be accepted by credit card only by accessing https://www.mymealtime.com/.

- Milk, by itself, is 60¢ for both breakfast and/or lunch.
- Breakfast, including a milk, is \$2.30.
- A full lunch, including milk, is \$3.70.
- Recess will take place during the last 15 minutes of the lunch block.
- Water bottles are allowed during school.
- Students can bring a snack to eat during snack time during the day.
- Student birthdays will be recognized during morning announcements. but only non-edible treats can be brought to share with classmates.



Supplies

 Students are required to come to school each day prepared with their own supplies.

 School supplies will be kept in each child's plastic shoe box and pencil cases at school.

 Hand washing/hand sanitizing will be regularly taking place during the day, therefore students will be able to share math manipulatives and other shared resources in the classroom

 Students are also required to come to school every day with their iPad. PLEASE MAKE SURE THE iPAD IS FULLY CHARGED EACH DAY!


